Türkiye's Exports Hit 2nd-Highest March Figure On Record



Turkish exports hit their second-highest March figure on record, totaling \$23.4 billion, up 3.2% from the same month last year, Turkish trade minister Prof Dr Ömer Bolat announced.

Türkiye's foreign trade deficit fell 0.5% to \$7.3 billion during the same period, Bolat added, noting that the export-import coverage ratio improved 0.7 percentage points, rising to 76.3% in March.

In January-March, Türkiye's overseas shipments reached \$65.3 billion, up 2.5% from last year.

Türkiye's E-Exports Hit \$6.4b In 2024

2025 e-export target set at \$8B by Turkish Trade Ministry



Türkiye's e-exports reached \$6.4 billion in 2024, jumping 27% from the previous year, according to a statement by Türkiye's Trade Ministry. The share of Turkish e-exports in the total goods exports in 2024 was 2.6%, up from 2.12% in 2023.

To ensure that e-exports' economic contributions continue to rise, the country is seeking to increase its e-export volume to \$8 billion in 2025. The target for e-exports' share in the total goods exports in 2028 is set to be 10%.

G20 Economy Expands 0.9% In Q4

GDP growth rebounded noticeably in Türkiye and South Africa in last quarter of 2024, says OECD



Gross domestic product in the G20 region rose 0.9% in the fourth quarter of 2024 on a quarterly basis, the Organization for Cooperation and Development said. "Quarterly G20 GDP growth rates remained relatively stable over the past two years, ranging between 0.6 and 1.0%," it said.

It stressed that GDP growth rebounded noticeably in the fourth quarter in Türkiye from minus 0.1% to 1.7%, and in South Africa from minus 0.1% to 0.6%. Growth rose in China from 1.3% to 1.6%, India from 1.4% to 1.6%, Australia from 0.3% to 0.6%, Japan from 0.4% to 0.6%, Canada from 0.5% to 0.6%), and in both Italy and the UK from 0% to 0.1%.

Growth was stable in Indonesia at 1.2% and South Korea at 0.1%, while the remaining G20 countries experienced either contractions or slowdowns in growth in Q4 compared with Q3. GDP contracted in Mexico 0.6%, Germany 0.2% and France 0.1%, and growth slowed in the US from 0.8% to 0.6%, Saudi Arabia from 0.9% to 0.5%. and Brazil from 0.7% to 0.2%.

Türkiye will ramp up trade efforts with the US and push for the removal of new tariffs imposed by Washington, Trade Minister Ömer Bolat said.



FAO Food Price Index Stable In March 2025

The FAO Food Price Index (FFPI) averaged 127.1 points in March 2025, remaining nearly unchanged from February. Declines in cereals and sugar price indices offset increases in those of meat and vegetable oils, while the dairy price index remained stable. Overall, the FFPI was 8.2 points (6.9 percent) higher than its corresponding level one year ago but remained 33.1 points (20.7 percent) below its peak reached in March 2022.



The **FAO Cereal Price Index** averaged 109.7 points in March, down 2.9 points (2.6 percent) from the previous month and 1.2 points (1.1 percent) lower than in March 2024. Global wheat prices declined in March as concerns over crop conditions subsided in some major Northern Hemisphere exporters, while uncertainty over rising trade tensions weighed on market sentiment. However, the decline was moderated by currency movements, tighter supply pressure in the Russian Federation, and Türkiye's removal of its wheat import quota. Following several consecutive monthly increases, world maize prices also declined in March, driven by improved crop conditions in Brazil with recent rainfall, the start of the harvest in Argentina, bearish projections for the coming season in the United States of America, weaker-than-anticipated import demand from China, and concerns over trade policy changes in various countries. Among other coarse grains, world sorghum prices declined, while barley prices increased slightly. Meanwhile, the FAO All Rice Price Index declined by 1.7 percent in March, as weak import demand and ample exportable supplies kept export quotations under downward pressure.

The **FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index** averaged 161.8 points in March, up 5.8 points (3.7 percent) monthon-month and remaining significantly higher (23.9 percent) than its level a year earlier. The continued increase in the index was driven by higher prices of palm, soy, rapeseed and sunflower oils. International palm oil prices rose for the second consecutive month, primarily due to persistently tight supplies in major producing countries in Southeast Asia, where outputs were at their seasonal lows. Meanwhile, world soyoil quotations increased, supported by robust global import demand due to its price competitiveness relative to other oils, despite subdued demand from the biofuel sector, particularly in the United States of America. International rapeseed and sunflower oil prices also increased from February, reflecting dwindling supplies from major exporters coinciding with a firm global import demand.

The **FAO Meat Price Index** averaged 118.0 points in March, up 1.0 point (0.9 percent) from the revised February value and 3.1 points (2.7 percent) from its year-earlier level. The increase was primarily driven by higher pig meat prices, mainly due to rising quotations in the European Union after Germany regained foot-and-mouth-disease-free status, prompting key trading partners, such as the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, to lift import bans. Rising demand contributed to stabilizing the market, while the strengthening of the euro against the United States dollar supported the upward trend. Ovine meat prices also increased, supported by strong global demand ahead of the Easter holidays. Similarly, world bovine meat quotations rose, reflecting tight global supplies and robust international demand. Meanwhile, poultry meat prices remained largely stable, as global supply and demand remained balanced despite the continued challenges posed by widespread avian influenza outbreaks in some major producing countries.

The **FAO Dairy Price Index** stood at 148.7 points in March, unchanged from February 2025 but still 24.6 points (19.9 percent) higher than its value a year ago. The index stability reflects a decline in international cheese prices offset by increases in butter and milk powder quotations. International butter prices increased for the third consecutive month, up 3.9 percent compared to February, driven by strong retail sales and growing international demand amid seasonally declining supplies in Oceania and sluggish production in Europe. Skim milk powder prices increased for the second consecutive month, supported by combination of strong international demand and tightening supplies. International quotations for whole milk powder also rose slightly, as mixed export demand in Europe—affected by the presence of foot and mouth disease in some European countries—was largely balanced by weaker global purchasing activity from Oceania amid seasonally declining milk production. International cheese prices decreased by 1.8 percent after nine months of consecutive increases, driven by stable supply in Europe alongside weakening international and domestic demand in Oceania.

The **FAO Sugar Price Index** averaged 116.9 points in March, down 1.6 points (1.4 percent) from February and 16.5 points (12.3 percent) from its value a year ago. The decline was mainly driven by signs of weaker global demand, which has alleviated concerns over tight global sugar supplies. Additionally, recent rainfall in key sugarcane growing areas of southern Brazil, following a period of prolonged dry weather, further contributed to the decline in world sugar prices. However, deteriorating production prospects in India and persisting concerns about the overall outlook for the sugarcane crop in Brazil continued to exert upward pressure on prices, limiting the monthly decline in March.

Türkiye Led Europe In Agricultural Output In 2023



Turkish agricultural sector accounts for 7% of GDP, ranks 8th worldwide, according to UN data

Türkiye became a leader in agricultural output with \$68.9 billion, as the importance of food security came to the fore following the pandemic and geopolitical conflicts around the world, according to the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (UNFAO) data.

The data showed that Türkiye produces 206 types of agricultural products, and it is self-sufficient in most of them. Türkiye ranked 4th around the world in vegetable and fruit production, 11th in crop production, and eighth in overall agricultural output, while dominating Europe. Türkiye's agricultural sector accounts for 7% of gross domestic product (GDP), and it employs 20% of the workforce.

Turkish raw milk production came in at ninth worldwide and third in Europe, while its beef production ranked seventh around the globe and first in Europe, and its chicken production stood at ninth in the world and second in Europe. Türkiye's egg production ranked 10th worldwide and second in Europe, and its honey production came in second around the globe and first in Europe. Turkish aquaculture ranked 16th in the world and second in Europe.

Turkish agricultural output rose from \$25 billion in 2002 to \$74 billion in 2024 while its agricultural exports increased from \$3.8 billion to \$32.6 billion over the same period. The UNFAO data showed that China ranked first in agricultural output with \$855.9 billion in 2013, followed by India with \$318.4 billion and the US with \$222.5 billion. Türkiye ranked eighth worldwide with \$63.9 billion in 2013.

In 2023, China led once again with \$1.2 trillion, followed by India with \$570.7 billion and the US with \$222.2 billion. Türkiye ranked eighth with \$68.9 billion. Türkiye's top spot in Europe was followed by Russia with \$67.7 billion and France with \$53.1 billion.

EU Exports \$85b Worth Of Iron, Steel In 2024

Türkiye, India main partners for EU in iron, steel last year



The 27-member EU exported iron and steel worth €77.8 billion (around \$85 billion) worldwide last year, Eurostat released. The EU's imports in the iron-steel field totaled €73.1 billion, and the foreign trade surplus was at €4.7 billion, official figures showed. In a five-year period from 2019, exports increased by 9.9% and imports by 19.7%. On the iron and steel side, the country's exports totaled €45.5 billion, up 19.3%, and imports amounted to €33.6 billion, up by 28.7% over the same period.

Eurostat said: "For iron and steel, Türkiye was one of the main partners both for exports and imports in 2024, occupying the 1st place in exports with a total of \notin 6.2 billion and 3rd place in imports with \notin 3.5 billion. "The United States was the second biggest export partner with \notin 5.4 billion worth of iron and steel, followed by the United Kingdom (\notin 4.0 billion), Switzerland (\notin 2.1 billion) and Mexico (\notin 1.7billion)."

Türkiye, China To Cooperate On AI In Medicine, Agricultural Projects

Researchers from Türkiye and China will conduct oncology studies using large-scale data sets and AI



Türkiye's Scientific and Technological Research Institution and China's National Natural Science Foundation will collaborate on the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in medicine, focusing on cancer and magnetic resonance imaging, as well as joint projects on agricultural sustainability. The two bodies have issued a call for bilateral cooperation on research projects, one of which is the "Cancer Immunotherapy and Clinical Translation Research."

This project aims to develop medical treatments, such as drugs and vaccines, to enhance the immune system's ability to fight cancer cells. Researchers from Türkiye and China will conduct oncology studies using large-scale data sets and AI. The research will also include a "Magnetic Resonance Imaging and Ultrasonic Medicine" study, in which researchers will take advantage of AI to make three-dimensional anatomical images through developing magnetic resonance technologies. The "Green and Sustainable Agriculture" project will focus on research related to the European Green Deal, which aims to ensure food security, combat biodiversity loss and reduce the environmental and climate effects of the EU food system. Türkiye and the EU are cooperating on the initiative.
