#### Türkiye's Exports Climb 2.2% to \$22.7B in November

## Country sets a new record for exports over last 12 months with \$270.6B, says Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat



Türkiye's exports amounted to \$22.7 billion in November, rising 2.2% year-on-year despite a negative calendar effect, the Turkish trade minister announced.

At a news conference in Ankara, Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat said the country also set a new record with exports reaching \$270.6 billion over the last 12 months.

During the first 11 months of the year, the country's

exports also amounted to \$247.2 billion, rising 3.7% year-on-year. In that 11-month period, nine months saw a rise in Türkiye's exports, Bolat explained.

# Türkiye's Economy Saw 3.7% Annual Growth in Q3, Ranking 4th Among OECD Countries: Turkish President

'Our economy has continued its growth trend, which it has maintained for 21 quarters, in the third quarter of 2025,' Recep Tayyip Erdoğan says



Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said that the country's economy grew 3.7% on an annual basis in the third quarter, maintaining its upward trend, and also ranking fourth among the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) countries. "Our economy has continued its growth trend, which it has maintained for 21 quarters, in the third quarter of 2025," Erdoğan said in the parliament in Ankara.

Erdoğan also touched on the rising tourism in Türkiye, saying the number of visitors in the first nine months of 2025 increased by 1.6% compared to the same period last year. "We achieved \$50 billion in tourism revenue in the first three quarters, thus breaking an all-time three-quarter record," Erdoğan said. He highlighted the decline in Türkiye's risk premium, emphasizing that the country's credit risk premium (CDS) fell to 233 basis points, the lowest level in seven years.

Erdoğan said the November inflation figures released raised their hopes. "Accordingly, our November inflation rate came in at 0.87%. Core goods inflation fell to around 18%. Meanwhile, the decline in services inflation continues."

On relations with Africa, Erdoğan emphasized that trade with the African continent has increased from \$5 billion to \$37 billion in 20 years, with a target of \$50 billion. He said direct investments have reached \$10 billion, and Turkish companies have undertaken more than 2,000 projects worth \$97 billion.

He emphasized that 2026 will be a "year of international summits" for Türkiye, announcing that the country will host COP31, the NATO summit, and the 13th summit of the Organization of Turkic States.

Erdoğan also recalled the Nov. 29 test of the first unmanned combat aircraft capable of striking a target beyond visual range from air to air. "Türkiye gained strategic advantage in air defense," he added.

## Türkiye E-Commerce Week Kicks Off in İstanbul Under 'Future-Commerce' Theme

# 17,000 participants gather to discuss growth, AI opportunities and digital transformation in e-commerce



Türkiye E-Commerce Week began in Istanbul, bringing together stakeholders from across the sector under the theme "Future-Commerce." The two-day event is organized by the Trade Ministry, the Electronic Commerce Operators Association (ETID), and the Union of Chambers and Commodity Exchanges (TOBB).

The program features panels, masterclasses, workshops, exhibitions, experience zones, startup-to-business meetings, and networking sessions, aiming to shape Türkiye's digital commerce vision by connecting industry professionals, investors, academics, public officials, and consumers.

Success stories from Türkiye and abroad, entrepreneurial breakthroughs, Al-driven opportunities, and the impacts of digital transformation will be highlighted throughout the event. Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat said at the opening ceremony that the event is hosting 17,000 participants and is expected to be a major success for the sector.

Bolat highlighted the rapid growth of e-commerce, accelerated by the pandemic. "Until then, e-commerce's share of global and Turkish commerce was around 4.5-5%, but in two or three years, it rose to 21%. Currently, one in every five transactions is e-commerce," he said. The minister also stressed the importance of regulations in ensuring fair competition among marketplaces and the creation of a multi-player market structure. Consumer protection measures, including transparency in terms of use, withdrawal rights, return processes, and seller obligations, have been made clear and explicit, he added.

## Booming \$7T Halal Market Strengthens Confidence in Sector's Future: Turkish President

World halal sector's size reaches \$7 trillion and many people in the world choose halal products, President Erdoğan says.



Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan has said that the global halal sector has grown to \$7 trillion, and that many people around the world now prefer halal products.

The fact that halal products and services are offered to consumers who place importance on cleanliness, health, and are religiously sensitive, reaching around two billion people worldwide, boosts confidence in the sector's future, he added.

In a message to the opening ceremony of the World Halal Summit, Erdoğan recalled that the summit hosted 50,000 visitors from 50 countries and over 500 firms last year, adding he believes that these figures will increase this year. The summit is the biggest event in the global halal market, and will have a significant impact on the sector, the president added.

The World Halal Summit and Halal Expo kicked off simultaneously in Istanbul, bringing together sector participants under the main theme of "Strengthening Halal Industry via Innovation and Excellence." The 11th edition of the World Halal Summit and Expo runs from November 26 to 29, under the auspices of the Turkish presidency, with the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and several institutions, including the Turkish Trade Ministry and the Halal Accreditation Agency.

Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat said the world is going through a difficult period, protectionism is on the rise, and customs duties are increasing. He stressed that the goal of the Muslim world is for Islamic countries to demonstrate greater solidarity during this difficult period, strengthen economic development, and increase trade among themselves.

#### Türkiye Concluded G20 Summit with Focus on Gaza, Global Solidarity, Says Turkish President

Recep Tayyip Erdoğan says G20 summit in South Africa highlighted need for solidarity, inclusive growth, and urgent steps to ease Gaza's suffering



Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said that Türkiye had concluded the G20 Leaders' Summit in Johannesburg, South Africa, held under the main theme "Solidarity, Equality, Sustainability." Erdoğan said he was pleased to see a G20 summit held in Africa for the first time, noting that he underlined in his addresses at the event the global responsibility to alleviate the destruction in Gaza, called for increased humanitarian assistance, and urged support for reconstruction efforts.

Erdoğan added that Türkiye will continue to maintain its principled stance for peace, stability, and security for the oppressed Palestinian people, the wider region, and humanity at large. The president said he also conveyed Türkiye's views on combating climate change, advancing green transformation, sustainable development, and the impact of technological progress on development policies.

He noted that he held bilateral meetings with participating leaders and exchanged views on key issues, including those of Australia, Mexico, Indonesia, South Korea, Canada, Angola, Ethiopia, France, Brazil, Malaysia, Italy, and Singapore, as well as the UN secretary-general, the European Commission president, and representatives of various international organizations. "We underscored the need to build a more inclusive and resilient global economy that leaves no one behind," he emphasized.

On the sidelines of the summit, the president took part in a meeting of leaders of MIKTA – a cross-regional consultative platform made up Türkiye, Mexico, Indonesia, South Korea, and Australia – hosted by South Korea, the current chair, and said that a joint statement was issued afterward. He added that Türkiye will work to further strengthen cooperation with MIKTA countries, all of which are also G20 members, in the coming days.

## **Development Experts Gather in İstanbul to Discuss Future of Global Growth**

Leaders from governments, business sector, and academia convened for the 2025 Istanbul Development Dialogues, a UN-backed forum for advancing sustainable development



The İstanbul Development Dialogues opened in the Turkish metropolis, bringing together global policymakers, business leaders, and development experts for two days of discussions on the future of sustainable growth. The annual forum, organized by the UN Development Programme (UNDP) along with the Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TIKA) and Türkiye's Foreign Ministry, has become one of the region's key platforms for shaping development policy since it was launched a decade ago.

This year's event, held under the theme "Shaping Development Futures," also included the Türkiye launch of the 2025 Human Development Report and a conversation on development trends across Europe and Central Asia. Several sessions throughout the day explored regional human development trends, the role of AI in inclusive growth, digital solutions for sustainability, and partnerships aimed at resilience and recovery.

#### Turkish, Iranian Foreign Ministers Pledge Closer Cooperation on Trade, Migration, Regional Issues

Ankara and Tehran outline plans to boost trade, upgrade border crossings, coordinate on migration and confront regional crises



Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan underscored the need to boost cooperation between Türkiye and Iran in trade, energy, and regional security, speaking to reporters in the capital Tehran on a working visit to the country.

"Trade and energy are top priorities, and we saw again today there is much more to be done," Fidan said alongside Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, noting the countries' long-standing coordination. He said the sides had agreed to improve border efficiency, boost the number of border gates, and implement logistics and transportation projects.

"Our countries have large populations, close relations, and high trade, but our trade needs to be more efficient," Fidan said. The two foreign ministers also agreed to hold the ninth Türkiye-Iran High-Level Cooperation Council meeting soon at the presidential level.

## Turkish, South Korean Presidents Discuss Steps to Bolster Defense Industry Cooperation

"We have realized important projects in defense industry with our strategic partner South Korea"



Speaking at a joint press conference with President Lee of South Korea, President Erdoğan said: "We have thus far realized important projects in defense industry with our strategic partner South Korea." President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan delivered remarks at a joint press conference with President Lee Jae Myung of the Republic of Korea at the Presidential Complex in Ankara.

President Erdoğan said: "We have thus far realized important projects in defense industry with our strategic partner South Korea. As you know, the delivery of our national tanks to our military began last month. We aim to further diversify joint projects in this area. During our talks, we have discussed that we can take many steps in defense industry with South Korea in the upcoming period. In the meantime, talks regarding the construction of a nuclear power plant continue between our relevant institutions."

The two presidents discussed cooperation in many areas, including trade, tourism, energy, defense, technology, and investments, Erdoğan noted. They also agreed to continue cooperation in platforms such as the UN, G20, and the cross-regional consultative platform MIKTA. Erdoğan underlined the strong potential of artificial intelligence, semiconductors, battery technology, and renewable energy, noting new agreements on wind energy and cooperation in the field of blood plasma. He expressed his satisfaction with hosting a South Korean presidential visit after many years and stated that the visit further strengthened the Türkiye-South Korea ties.

## Türkiye, Germany Set to Deepen Cooperation: Fidan

During the Berlin talks, Turkish FM Hakan Fidan says political will is strong to advance bilateral ties and revive the stalled Türkiye–EU accession process.



Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan has said in Berlin that Türkiye and Germany are poised to deepen their cooperation, "which rests on strong foundations," stressing a renewed political will to advance bilateral ties and revive momentum in Turkish–EU relations. "There is a very strong will to take Türkiye–Germany relations, as well as Türkiye–EU relations, even further in these uncertain and crisis-driven times. As foreign ministers, we are carrying out the necessary planning and coordination," he said.

Addressing a joint press conference with German Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul in Berlin as part of his visit to the country, Fidan said relations between Türkiye and Germany recently gained "new momentum with a new spirit," citing as evidence the recent visits to Türkiye by Wadephul and German Chancellor Friedrich Merz. He announced that the next meeting of the countries' Strategic Dialogue Mechanism would be held in the first half of 2026.

Fidan noted that Germany is Türkiye's number one export market in Europe and its largest export destination globally, adding that the bilateral trade volume is trending upward from \$50 billion toward \$60 billion. He stressed that efforts continue to further increase mutual investments. "The meeting of the Joint Economic and Trade Committee, expected to be held in the first half of next year, along with the energy and mining forum, will help advance our economic ties. "In addition to the sectors in which we are already strong, there is a significant potential for cooperation in fields shaping the 21st century, such as renewable energy, artificial intelligence, high technology, and digitalisation."

Highlighting the major contributions of the Turkish community in Germany in fields ranging from the economy to science, arts and sports, Fidan said their achievements are "a source of pride for both Türkiye and Germany." Fidan added that during his visit, he would also meet with businesspeople and representatives of civil society organisations operating in Germany.


Fidan said Türkiye—EU relations will also be discussed during his talks with Wadephul and that Türkiye agrees accession must be based on criteria. Türkiye, he added, could quickly fulfill many criteria if it saw a renewed, practical EU accession perspective. "We once again underlined how strong President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan's political will is on Türkiye's EU process. We believe there are steps that can be taken, and we reviewed them one by one," he said. He noted ongoing issues such as updating the Customs Union, visa liberalization dialogue, and the difficulties Turkish citizens face in getting Schengen visas. He underlined the importance of including Türkiye in the new Security Action for Europe (SAFE) program and ensuring the country is not excluded, adding that Türkiye has significant capacity in the defense industry. Pointing to the Turkish Armed Forces' extensive operational experience in the region, Fidan said this experience should be evaluated in a principled and constructive manner in a way that serves the interests of both sides in terms of European security.

## The FAO Food Price Index Eased Further in October, With All Indices But Vegetable Oils Down

The FAO Food Price Index\* (FFPI) averaged 126.4 points in October 2025, down 2.1 points (1.6 percent) from the revised September level of 128.5 points, marking its second consecutive monthly decline. Lower price indices for cereals, dairy products, meat and sugar outweighed an increase in the vegetable oil index. Overall, the FFPI was slightly below its October 2024 level and remained 33.8 points (21.1 percent) lower than its peak in March 2022.



The FAO Cereal Price Index averaged 103.6 points in October, down 1.3 points (1.3 percent) from September and 10.9 points (9.5 percent) below its level a year ago. Price indices of all the major cereals declined month-on-month. The wheat price index fell by 1.0 percent, mostly reflecting ample global supplies, favourable production prospects in the southern hemisphere where harvesting is underway, and steady progress of winter wheat planting across the northern hemisphere. The coarse grain index declined by 1.1 percent in October, with lower quotations for barley, maize and sorghum. Downward pressure on prices was partly offset by reports of reduced maize yields in the European Union and potentially also in the United States of America, as well as news of trade agreements between China and the United States of America. The FAO All Rice Price Index fell by 2.5 percent in October 2025, driven by intensified competition for markets and the start of main-crop harvests in several northern hemisphere exporting countries.

The FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index averaged 169.4 points in October, up 1.5 points (0.9 percent) from September and reaching its highest level since July 2022. The increase reflected higher quotations for palm, rapeseed, soy and sunflower oils. International palm oil prices rebounded slightly after easing in the previous month, supported by expectations of tighter exportable supplies following Indonesia's planned increase in biodiesel blending mandates in 2026, and despite higher-than-expected production in Malaysia. World sunflower oil prices rose for the fourth consecutive month in October, largely due to limited supplies from the Black Sea region amid harvest delays and cautious farmer sales. Meanwhile, global rapeseed and soy oil prices increased on account, respectively, of persistent tight supplies in the European Union and higher domestic demand in Brazil and the United States of America.

The FAO Meat Price Index averaged 125.0 points in October, down 2.5 points (2.0 percent) from September but still 5.8 points (4.8 percent) above its level a year ago. After eight consecutive monthly increases, the decline was driven by sharp drops in pig and poultry meat prices and a fall in ovine meat prices, partially offset by higher bovine meat quotations. The pig meat price index declined amid abundant global supplies, with European Union's export quotations coming under additional downward pressure due to weaker import demand from China following the introduction of new import duties. The poultry meat price index also contracted significantly, reflecting lower export prices from Brazil, where high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI)-related trade restrictions by China prompted exporters to redirect sales to lower-priced destinations. The ovine meat price index decreased, particularly in Australia, as larger supplies entered the market. By contrast, the bovine meat price index continued to rise, driven by higher quotations from Australia due to firm global demand.

The FAO Dairy Price Index averaged 142.2 points in October 2025, down 5.0 points (3.4 percent) from September, marking the fourth consecutive monthly decline. Despite this decline, the index remained 2.7 percent above its level a year earlier. All sub-indices dropped – butter fell by 6.5 percent, whole milk powder by 6.0 percent, skim milk powder by 4.0 percent, and cheese by 1.5 percent. The continued decline in the butter price index largely reflected ample export availabilities from European Union and New Zealand, as moderate seasonal temperatures boosted milk production amid weaker import demand from Asia and the Middle East. Milk powder quotations also fell due to limited demand and strong export competition. The cheese price index declined only slightly, as modest easing in the European Union—where milk supplies remain adequate and export demand subdued—was partly offset by firmer prices in Oceania, supported by solid Asian orders and tighter early-season supplies.

The FAO Sugar Price Index averaged 94.1 points in October, down 5.3 points (5.3 percent) from September. This marks the second consecutive monthly decline, pushing the index 35.4 points (27.4 percent) below its level a year ago and to its lowest level since December 2020. The drop was mainly driven by expectations of ample global sugar supplies. In Brazil's key southern growing regions, favourable weather conditions supported a strong pace of production in recent weeks. Anticipated larger outputs in Thailand and in India, where early crushing operations have started, further reinformed to the positive global sugar supply outlook and weighed on prices. Additionally, lower international crude oil prices exerted further downward pressure on world sugar prices, through lower demand by the biofuel sector.

## **Türkiye Leads World in Wide Range of Agricultural Products**

Türkiye produces world's most hazelnuts, apricots, poppy seeds, cherries, quinces, and carobs, according to Turkish Agriculture and Forestry Ministry



Türkiye is leading the world with its rich, fertile lands, ranking among the top three in 22 agricultural products, while continuing to be a major player in the sector, according to data from the Turkish Agriculture and Forestry Ministry. Türkiye boasts nearly 150,000 square miles of agricultural land, where various products, ranging from vegetables to fruits and grains, are grown. The country stood out in global agricultural

production, ranking first worldwide in annual production of hazelnuts, figs, apricots, poppy seeds, cherries, quinces, and carobs.

Türkiye ranked first worldwide in apricot production, with 750,000 tons and produced 736,791 tons of cherries, accounting for 25% of the world's cherry production of 2.9 million tons, coming in first place. Türkiye also ranked first in fig production with 350,000 tons produced annually, meanwhile, Türkiye produced over half of the world's hazelnuts at 650,000 tons on an annual basis out of the 1.1 million tons worldwide. Türkiye ranked first in quince production, with 192,237 tons out of a global total of 687,036 tons. In carob production, Türkiye led the world with 24,561 tons produced. Türkiye produced the most poppy seeds in the world, accounting for 7,922 tons produced out of the world's 10,578-ton annual production. At the same time, Türkiye ranked second in cucumber and cherry production and third in mandarin, peach, spinach, chickpea, apple, cranberry, watermelon, melon, leek, pepper, tomato, and olive production, the data showed.

## Türkiye's Defense Industry Exports Jump 31% to \$6.7B in First 10 Months of Year

Defense and aviation sector's share of Türkiye's overall exports this January to October also up to 3.5%



Türkiye's defense and aviation industry exports jumped 31% year-on-year in the first 10 months of 2025 to \$6.7 billion, the head of the country's Defense Industries Secretariat said. With this rise, the share of the defense and aerospace sector in Türkiye's overall exports has climbed to 3.5%, he said.

He added: "This sustained export success in our sector is the result of the defense industry cooperation activities we carry out around the world. "We continue these efforts with unflagging determination."

#### Türkiye to Accelerate 'Twin Transformation' in Construction Sector in 2026

## Program aims to boost global competitiveness through green and digital shift



Türkiye will accelerate green and digital transformation in its construction sector next year to strengthen the global competitiveness of contracting and consultancy firms, according to the country's 2026 Presidential Annual Program. The initiative -- described as a "twin transformation" -- aims to expand the use of renewable resources, strengthen supply chains, and support production of low-carbon building materials at competitive costs, while pushing the sector toward higher technology capabilities.

The program highlights increased importance of carbon-neutral concrete, artificial intelligence, 3D-printed structures, recycled smart materials that improve energy efficiency, and monitoring by unmanned aerial vehicles. These technologies are expected to reduce costs and risks while requiring adaptation to new standards. To support the transition, the government will establish a national green certification system to verify environmentally friendly buildings and settlements, and expand the number of certified structures. Architecture and engineering curricula at universities will be updated to train qualified workers in areas such as building information modeling, circular economy practices, energy efficiency, and administrative fields including law, contracts, and project and risk management. Research, development, and innovation activities in construction will also be encouraged under the program.

Turkish contractors have undertaken 12,627 projects worth \$543.6 billion in 137 countries to date. Of these, rail projects accounted for 26.1% and road, tunnel, and bridge projects for 14.1%. For 2026, the total project value for global technical consulting services is projected to reach \$210 million, while business volume for global contracting services is expected to hit \$28 billion.

## Türkiye Attracts 47.25M Foreign Tourists in January-October

Istanbul hosted around 34% of all tourists in 1st 10 months, while Mediterranean resort city of Antalya drew 32.5% of foreign arrivals



Türkiye hosted 47.25 million foreign tourists in the first 10 months of 2025, according to official figures released. The number of foreign arrivals this January-October was down 0.1% compared to the same period last year, said Culture and Tourism Ministry data. Istanbul, Türkiye's largest city by population and a top tourist destination, welcomed 33.9% of all foreign visitors, or 16.01 million, in the 10-month period.

It was followed by the Mediterranean resort city of Antalya, and the northwestern city of Edirne, which borders both Bulgaria and Greece. In October alone, 5.68 million foreigners visited Türkiye, up 4.3% on a yearly basis.
